Ms. Soonhee Kim, CIO and partner of OPT SEA, is another speaker invited for this event. Over the past 15 years she has gathered extensive experience in a large number of investment activities and has worked on many business development projects. Since she joined OPT in 2005, she has managed overseas business development for a number of countries including the United States and Korea. Currently based in Thailand, she is serving as the COO, CIO and partner at OPT.

Shannon Kalyanamitr, the moderator for this event, has a strong background in international business development, project management and marketing.
